



Lions Clubs International "Code of Ethics": A Tribute to Melvin Jones



Melvin Jones was the son of Lydia M. Gibler and Captain Calvin Jones of the United States Army stationed at Fort Thomas, Arizona. During his early childhood Melvin Jones memories were filled with blue-clad troopers riding horses with bugles dangling from their sides and war cries, while wagon trains filled with settlers going west passed through the military facility he called home.

As a young man, Melvin Jones attended the Union Business School at Chaddock College in Quincy, Illinois. Torn between deciding if he should pursue a

career as an attorney or as a tenor, he gave up both and a took a position in an insurance agency. It was through this connection Melvin Jones developed a circle of business friends which later become the foundation for Lions Clubs International. The purpose of this group was business "pure and simple".

In 1915 Melvin Jones became the secretary for his business circle. It soon became obvious to this young man a sense of positive values was missing from his business circle as everything was directed toward personal gains . After some searching Melvin Jones came up with what is listed below as the Lions Clubs International "Code of Ethics". To the best of my knowledge this is the only document which contains only "Positive" statements and no negatives or thou shall not's.

 To Show my faith in the worthiness of my vocation by industrious application to the end that I may merit a reputation for quality of service.

- **To Seek** success and to demand all fair remuneration or profit as my just due, but to accept no profit or success at the price of my own self-respect lost because of unfair advantage taken or because of questionable acts on my part.
- **To Remember** that in building up my business it is not necessary to tear down another's; to be loyal to my clients or customers and true to myself.
- Whenever a doubt arises as to the right or ethics of my position or action towards others, to resolve such doubt against myself.
- **To Hold** friendship as an end and not a means. To hold that true friendship exists not on account of the service performed by one to another, but that true friendship demands nothing but accepts service in the spirit in which it is given.
- **Always** to bear in mind my obligations as a citizen to my nation, my state, and my community, and to give them my unswerving loyalty in word, act, and deed. To give them freely of my time, labor and means.
- **To Aid** others by giving my sympathy to those in distress, my aid to the weak, and my substance to the needy.
- **To Be Careful** with my criticism and liberal with my praise; to build up and not destroy.

Missouri Lions MD-26 2013 Proposed Changes to By-Laws

PROPOSITION NO. 1

A RESOLUTION TO INCREASE MULTIPLE DISTRICT DUES EFFECTIVE WITH FISCAL YEAR 2013-2014. A MODEST DUES INCREASE WILL ALLOW THE ASSOCIATION TO CONTINUE TO SERVE THE MEMBERSHIP BY MAINTAINING EXISTING PROGRAMS AND SERVICES.

SHALL THE FOLLOWING RESOLUTION BE ADOPTED?

BE IT RESOLVED, that effective July 1, 2013, Article III, Section 1(a) and Section 2(a) of the Multiple District 26 By-Laws be amended to read as follows:

Section 1. (a) To provide necessary revenues for the State Lions activities, there shall be levied upon each Lion in each District an annual per capita tax of \$9.00 \$10.50; except in years during which Multiple District 26 has an endorsed candidate for International Director or International Vice President or has a sitting International Vice President, President, or Immediate Past President the annual per capita tax shall be \$10.50 \$12.00 commencing with the first billing following said endorsement and continuing until said condition no longer exists.

Section 2. (a) $\$9.00 \ \$10.50 \ (\$10.50 \ \$12.00)$ if the exception in Section 1(a) has been invoked) per member of the annual per capita tax shall be forwarded by the District Cabinet Secretary-Treasurer in semi-annual installments to the State Council Secretary-Treasurer and shall be divided in the following proportions and placed in the following funds by the State Council Secretary- Treasurer: \$0.70 per year in the International Convention Fund; $\$7.40 \ \8.70 per year in the State Administrative Fund; \$0.70 per year in the Missouri Lions All-State Band Fund; and $\$0.20 \ \0.40 per year in the International Candidates' Election Fund except when the condition in Section 1(a) is invoked the International Candidates' Election Fund will receive $\$1.70 \ \1.90 per year.

Again this year, the Missouri Lions All State Band will start with their practice session at Fort Leonard Wood before they depart on their adventure. As before, the Band will again play at several Veterans Homes and for various Lions Clubs along their journey. The final destination for the 2013 Missouri Lions All State Band is New Orleans, Louisiana.

This is a tremendous opportunity for members of the band to experience our country first hand and learn about Lionism along the way.

New Orleans became a city in 1718, but did not get city streets until 3 years later. Our band members will soon learn as they read the street names in this wonderful city many are named for royal houses in France and Catholic Saints. They will also learn Bourbon Street is not named for the alcoholic beverage, but after the Royal House of Bourbon, the family which occupied the throne in France during this time period.

The Band members will see the architectural changes from the Spanish when they took over in 1763 from the French. The Spanish established new building codes for better roofs and buildings constructed with native brick walls. The French Quarter shows the architecture of the Spanish more than the French.

Providing Easy Access to your Lions Club "e-Club House" Web Site

One of the easiest ways to provide information about your club is through the use of an internet web site. There is a very economical and simple way to do so. Lions Clubs International provides all clubs with the ability to obtain a <u>free</u> web site at http://www.e-clubhouse.org/. This is a great tool <u>AND</u> you can make it even easier for the public, and potential or current members to reach you. It works this way...

First:

If you have not created a club web site already, this is a great way for your club to have a presence on the internet. The Lions Clubs International sight, http://www.e-clubhouse.org/, will lead you through step by step instructions to create and have your sight up and going. I recommend that a club member who is a bit (not necessary to be an expert) computer literate be the individual to create your club's web site. Someone needs to keep it current or the value diminishes over time. Get it all set up and accessible to view with the e-club address. An example below is to my club's "e-club house" sight:

Second:

In order to make it easier to remember, print or display, the site name needed to be shorter, in my opinion. To make the internet address easier to remember, print or display, you first need to go to a service where you can register and purchase/rent an internet Domain Name. I chose to use Go Daddy.Com to obtain a new domain name. That was due to my having other sights through their service. I was familiar with them. You can search for Domain Name providers and select from a number of them. Once you have a name registered, it is yours, regardless of where you obtained it.

The first thing to do (after establishing an account) is to see if an acceptable domain name (one your club would like to use) is available. There are a number of domain types like .COM, .BIZ, .US, .ORG and others. I chose to search for BonhommeLions.org. The system told me it was available. In this case, the charge is \$13.00 a year. I made the purchase. I set it up so that if anyone clicked on **bomhommelions.org** they would be sent/pointed to http://www.e-clubhouse.org/sites/bonhomme/index.php

Now our banners, signs and other communication only need to have the internet address **BonhommeLions.org**. I think it's a bit easier to remember and use. The capital letters are used for affect. The use of upper or lower case letters is not an issue here.

2013 Great Plains Lions Leadership Institute



Missouri Lions who have never attended the Great Plains Lions Leadership Institute will have an opportunity to attend in our own state this year. The 2013 Great Plains Lions Leadership Institute will be held July 26th- 28th on the campus of Northwest Missouri State University in Maryville, Missouri. This leadership institute is specifically structured for Lions who want to advance their skills either personally or professionally. Lions who attend the GPLLI will have an opportunity to learn or improve their leadership skills. If you have served as a District Governor or will be serving as the Governor during July 2013, you are not eligible to attend.

The Great Plains Lions Leadership Institute is sponsored by Multiple Districts 5 (Saskatchewan, North Dakota, and South Dakota), 9 (Iowa), 17 (Kansas), 26 (Missouri) and 38 (Nebraska. The cost is \$150 per attendee if received by the Registrar on or before May 31, 2013. This includes double occupancy accommodations, seven meals, as well as all course materials and the registration fee. Beginning, June 1, 2013 the cost will increase to \$170 per attendee. A limited number of single rooms are available for an additional \$40 per attendee.

The Haywood Snipes Society



The Haywood Snipes Society is the most prestigious honor the Missouri Lions Eye Research Foundation can bestow upon a Lion or Lions club. The Society was formed in honor of the late Past District Governor Haywood Snipes of Poplar Bluff, Missouri. PDG Snipes helped to create the Lions Eye Bank at the University of Missouri in 1960, and as chair of the Missouri Lions Sight Committee through the 1960s and early 1970s, he helped raise funds to expand the Missouri Lions Eye Bank and to build what is known today as the Missouri Lions Eye Research Foundation.

We are happy to honor his memory through this distinguished award. The legacy of PDG Snipes to the Missouri Lions is continued through the Haywood Snipes Society, which recognizes clubs that make exceptional

financial contributions to the Foundation, the Lions' State Sight Project. Each time a Lions club accumulates \$10,000 in financial contributions – since the program's inception on July 1, 1987 – the club receives the honor of electing a person to this society. A plaque inscribed with the name of the honoree is then presented to the club.

2012: A Statistical Perspective

2012 was a good year both for the Foundation and our Heartland Lions Eye Banks. Here's who we served:

- 2,464 people received donated corneal tissue through Heartland Lions Eye Banks.
- 42,398 children were screened by our Children's Vision Screening program, with 3,723 referred to eye doctors for follow-up examinations.
- 4,091 adults were screened for glaucoma and age-related macular degeneration by our Healthy Vision Screening program.
- 130 Missourians received Eye Care Assistance, totaling \$41,468 in eye care support.
- More than 10,000 recycled eyeglasses were distributed to people in developing countries.
- Ocular researchers at more than 20 nationally acclaimed institutions including University of Missouri - Columbia, UMKC School of Medicine, and Washington University School of Medicine – were supported with tissue from Heartland Lions Eye Banks.

Our Strides in 2012

Heartland Lions Eye Banks provided tissue for 4% more corneal transplants.

The Children's Vision Screening program screened 6% more children.

Eye Care Assistance provided 23% more financial assistance to Missourians in need.
