47th Annual Melvin Jones Memorial Re-dedication Ceremony



January 9, 2016

Fort Thomas, Arizona



January 13, 1879 - June 1, 1961

Fort Thomas, Arizona

Melvin Jones was born January 13, 1879 in the Arizona Territory, today this military facility is called Fort Thomas. He was the son of a captain in the United States Army stationed at Fort Thomas, Arizona. He spent the early years of his childhood watching the soldiers until approximately 1886 or 1887 when his parents moved east as his father was transferred to another facility.

After his family moved to the east, Melvin Jones settled in the Chicago area where he studied at Union Business and Chaddock Colleges of Quincy, Illinois. It is no surprise he would remain in the Chicago area to develop his own business. In 1912, Melvin Jones was the sole owner of his own insurance agency in Chicago, Illinois. This is where he became a member of the local business circle. After spending two years as the secretary for this business group, he proposed the circle of business members could provide needed services in their local communities. Then in 1917, Melvin Jones gave up his insurance agency to work full time at the Lions Clubs International headquarters.

The Melvin Jones Memorial was erected and dedicated to honor the founder of Lions Clubs International Association in 1965. Each year an Annual Rededication Ceremony is held at the facility, the ceremony for 2016 will be held on January 9th. Every Lion is invited to attend this

special ceremony to honor the founder of our organization.

Today members of the Melvin Jones International Memorial Board MJIM are working to restore the buildings that remain at Fort Thomas, Arizona. Proceeds from the **Melvin Jones International Memorial "Centennial" Brick** are being used to restore this historical facility.

Missouri Lions All Star Football

The process for selecting players for the 2016 Missouri Lions All Star Football Game is underway. Letters have gone out to ALL of the high school coaches in the state of Missouri explaining the game along with resumes to fill out and send back to the Missouri Lions State Office with their suggestions of senior players they feel are All Stars. This letter does go to all coaches but if you know of players who are All Stars it is always a good idea to get in touch with the coach. A lot of coaches misplace this letter and/or forget to send their picks in for consideration to play on one of the best games in the state of Missouri.

Once players are nominated and coaches are selected, the Missouri Lions Athletic committee along with the coaches for the 2016 game will conduct a draft to determine who will play for the Blue and Gold Teams. It is likely that players who were teammates in high school will find themselves on opposing teams.

The selected players spend a week in Warrensburg practicing and becoming a new team. During the week the teams experience a program from Saving Sight to better understand their role in raising funds for those less fortunate than themselves. They also have an afternoon to spend with the veterans at the Missouri Veterans home in Warrensburg. This is one of the favorite afternoons for a lot of the players. The pictures below show some of the interaction between players and the veterans.









Of course, this all takes funding. This is where the Lions and Lions clubs play a very important role. The Missouri Lions Athletic Committee estimates that it takes \$750 per player to fund the project. Clubs are asked to help raise the funds by selling ads in the football program and /or donations from Lions and Lions Clubs. Even if your community does not have a player, we need your support to help raise funds for Saving Sight.

The game will be played in Warrensburg on Saturday, July 23, 2016 beginning at 7:00 p.m. All proceeds from the All Star Football Game are donated to Saving Sight.





During the Second Quarterly Mid-South Lions Sight and Hearing Service meeting the President and Vice Presidents, Board Members and Trustees had a great brainstorming session. If each Lions Club could encourage their <u>members</u> to pledge a monthly donation of \$10 we would not have a waiting list of patients.

So here is the challenge: Club reward incentives are being developed for Lions Clubs who have a 25% level of members donating \$10/month or greater. The forms are on the page 12. Take the time to start your members donating to make a positive difference in the lives of families that we help. What better gift than the gift of sight or hearing?!



Gentry's Story

Glaucoma is an eye disease most commonly associated with the elderly. High intraocular pressure, often occurring with advanced age, causes damage to the optic nerve and slowly limits peripheral vision.

Gentry came into the world completely blind. Born with congenital glaucoma, Peter's anamoly (causing a cloudy cornea), and a protruding left cornea, Gentry had her first eye surgery when she was just two days old and received her first cornea transplant at one month to reconstruct her left eye and correct corneal cloudiness. Today at the age of four, she's overcome more than 20 separate surgeries and five cornea transplants, including a prosthesis.

In spite of every obstacle she's faced,
Gentry is a happy pre-kindergartner,
enjoying friends and her first year of
school. That Gentry dances, plays, reads,
and draws just like other kids her age, is
an achievement of modern medicine and
her parents' enduring support. As Gentry's
mother Becky put it, "It's amazing where we
started at compared to what Gentry's able
to do now."

Though she had never encountered donation or transplantation before her daughter's birth, Becky knows how important the the gift of sight is to people of all ages and has written to the loved ones who donated the gift of sight to Gentry in order to express her gratitude. "She has the chance to see like everyone else," she said.

Recently, her own family was directly impacted through the tragic death of a cousin, and because of Gentry's experience, eye, organ, and tissue donation were important to the family's legacy.
